

Kristian Vlahoviček (kristian@bioinfo.hr) studied molecular biology at the University of Zagreb, Croatia and obtained his PhD in Bioinformatics, working on a prediction of physicochemical properties of DNA. He spent 10 years as a research fellow at the International Center for Genetic Engineering and Biotechnology in Trieste, Italy. He established a computational biology group at the Zagreb University in 2002, where he moved permanently in 2006 with the EMBO Young Investigators Programme installation grant. He teaches computational biology and bioinformatics at the Faculty of Science, Division of Biology, and is also an adjunct associate professor at the University of Oslo, Norway. His scientific track-record includes more than 40 publications in high-level journals and talks in many renowned institutions throughout the world. His bioinformatics group develops computational tools and uses machine learning techniques to tackle open questions in developmental genomics and metagenomics.
